



BHSSA Sub-grant Awardees

Tri-City Mental Health Authority's (TCMHA) Behavioral Health Student Services Act (BHSSA) project aims to improve timely access to services for underserved and at-risk youth populations including foster youth, youth who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer, and youth who have been expelled or suspended from school.

TCMHA, in partnership with local school districts and organizations, uses grant funds to support recovery, assist with obtaining mental health services, and create rapid access-to-care pipelines and linkages to resources. Staff and grant partners provide mental health services in early intervention, suicide prevention, drop-out prevention, evidence-based mental health practices, and development and coordination of service plans for ongoing needs. The following organizations were selected for BHSSA sub-grant awards to support efforts that provide increased access to mental health services.
